# PARKING IN POUND AVENUE

Keith Smith, our Chair of Governors, recently had a meeting with Mr Stephen McPartland, the Local MP responsible for the Old town ward of Stevenage. Together with Mr Staples they discussed the problems the school community, and our neighbours, have with parking and the tight driving conditions experienced every day outside school. Mr McPartland was very helpful and informative. As a result, there have been two major changes to Pound Avenue; The lines and zig-zags outside the school have been repainted - these are there to show an area that is not allowed to be stopped on or parked across, as it reduces the visibility for other road users and pedestrians. Secondly, we now have regular visits from local Community Support Officers at the key times of the day, who are there to help with the traffic build up and advise the road users of safe practice (Hopefully they won't issue too many fines !!!).

This visit was a very important step for the school and the local community, as safety of the children, parents and staff is of paramount importance and safe use of the roads around the school plays a key part of this.

### **HELP US WITH HEADLICE**

Headlice in school is an on-going problem, but if everyone takes note of the preventative measures, then the problem should be dramatically reduced. The local Health Authority recommends the following preventative method and suggests that parents should take the responsibility of checking their child's and their own hair regularly.

#### The wet-combing method is the recommended preventative method and head lice may be cleared over a two-week period:

- •Wash the hair in the normal way with an ordinary shampoo.
- Using lots of hair conditioner and while the hair is very wet, comb through the hair from the roots with a fine tooth comb. Make sure the teeth of the comb slot into the hair at the roots with every stroke, and do this over a pale surface, such as a paper towel or the bath.
- Clear the comb of lice between each stroke.
- •Wet lice find it difficult to escape, and hair, which is slippery from conditioner, makes it hard for them to keep a grip – so removal with the comb is easier.
- If you find any lice, then repeat this routine every 3-4 days for 2 weeks, so that any lice emerging from the eggs are removed before they can spread.

Please be aware, if we notice your child is clearly uncomfortable due to headlice, we will contact you and ask you to come and collect him/her to treat the condition. We would not expect a child to be absent for a whole day for the treatment of headlice when the above method is used.
