#### FREE SCHOOL MEAL RENEWALS

Following last year's successful automated renewals process for free school meals, this summer applications will again be automatically renewed in readiness for the new academic year starting in September 2014.

Letters will only be sent to those families who are no longer entitled to support. If an applicant doesn't receive a letter, then they can assume their child will continue to receive free school meals for the next academic year (14/15).

Following the automated renewals process, families who no longer appear to qualify will be advised by letter that their free school meals will cease at the end of term (23rd July 2014). If the applicant feels that they still meet the criteria, they can make a new application against which we will carry out further checks.
