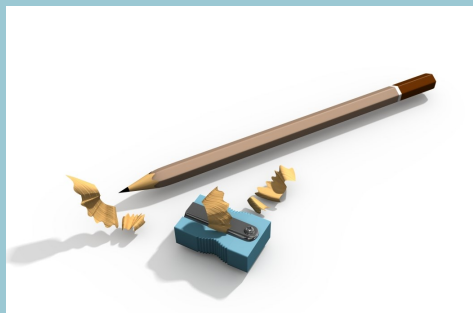

CLIC maths lessons start at 9:00 am

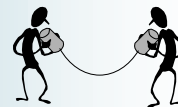
Teachers see their classes out at the dining hall at the end of the day, and are available to talk to parents.
