Thank you very much to Miss Pearson, Yr 5, for organising some really exciting events for Science Week last week:

In KS2, Year 6 were visited by Chris Woodard from Stevenage Borough Council Pest Control, who brought along some bugs, spiders and a snake and talked to the children about what makes an animal a 'pest' and how best to look after pets.

Year 5 visited Stevenage Museum where they designed and made a rocket to transport diamonds across a canyon! Years 3 & 4 carried out the same activity in school.

Children in KS1 and some of the children from the Foundation Stage enjoyed a wonderful workshop delivered by SETPOINT, on the theme of Our Bodies and Our Senses. There were many "doctors" in white coats, assisting the children, who were able to practise their scientific skills and learn new information. The day was thoroughly enjoyed by all and photographs should appear on the web site soon.

Those children in Reception who did not attend the workshop were treated to a short performance of "It's not magic – it's science", where they witnessed the power of magnets and static electricity. The event was organised by the KS1 School Councillors, but KS2 Councillors helped as well. We had to spend loads of time wrapping eggs (luckily there were one or two spare ones to eat!), and making decorations for the course.
