NEW ARRANGEMENTS FOR RECEPTION AT START AND END OF DAY!

We have reviewed our **start and end of day procedures for Reception children** and will be introducing the following from after half term.

From **Tuesday**, 3rd **June**, **Reception children** will now be lining up with the KS1 children in the **lower playground** first thing in the morning. They will be collected by their teacher and will walk in through the lower hall to their classroom. Reception staff will be out on the playground from 8.45am to meet with parents briefly if you need to; just like the KS1 staff have been doing for the past year. You will also have the opportuinity to catch *Mr* Staples, as he rings the bell there every morning!

At the **end of the day**, please now collect your children from the entrance to the **lower hall**.

We think these procedures will help to make the mornings more orderly, simpler for parents with children in KS1 and Reception, and will help to solve the slight problem we have had with some of the outside play equipment being tampered with first thing in the morning.

The children have had a practice today and I am sure they will be excited to show you on Tuesday how well they have done!

SCOOTERS IN SCHOOL

We notice that a number of children have started riding their foot scooters to school.

For safety reasons, all children should dismount from their scooters along the public footpath that runs between the two school buildings, and must not ride them in the school grounds.

SCHOOL COUNCIL UPDATE

SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER

Please can I remind parents that children should come to school wearing appropriate school uniform, in the correct school colours, as follows:

Plain blue, black or grey trousers (infants may wear plain jogging bottoms),

Plain navy blue/black or grey skirt or tunic Plain navy blue jumper / cardigan or school sweatshirt or fleece

Plain white shirt/blouse/polo shirt Blue and white checked school dress Flat shoes (no open-toed or backless sandals) Indoor shoes

PE Kit (blue/black shorts & white t-shirt)
For safety reasons, we ask that you do not allow your children to wear jewellery to school. Children may wear a watch, and stud earrings if they have their ears piered.

SAFETY IN THE SUN

Please ensure you apply sun cream to your child **before** school and that they have a **sun hat** with them every day. **Sun glasses** are not allowed in school unless required for medical reasons, in which case please write a letter of explaination your child's class teacher.
