All children are strongly encouraged to wear school uniform:

- White shirt/polo shirt
- Grey tailored skirt, dress, trousers or shorts
- 'Summer dress' with blue and white check or stripes
- Navy jumper, sweatshirt or cardigan school logo optional
 - Plain navy, grey or black tights;
 - Plain white, black or grey socks
 - Black shoes, plain black trainers, sandals or boots

PE Kit

Your child should come to school wearing their PE kit on their PE day

- Shorts plain navy
- Tops plain white or navy
- Footwear inside bare feet
- Footwear outside trainers that can be fastened
- Winter kit plain navy sweatshirt and jogging bottoms
- During PE lessons, all children will be asked to remove wrist watches and remove/cover their earrings. All classes will have a roll of tape to cover studs during PE lessons.

Jewellery & Make-Up

- We do not allow any jewellery in school, except for simple watches and one set of small, simple stud earrings.
- Children wearing any earrings other than small, simple studs will be asked to remove them or cover them.
- Children are now allowed to wear make-up to school. Please make every effort to remove any make-up, nail polish or temporary tattoos if your child has been to a party at the weekend.
- Mobile phones or wearable technology (e.g. smart watches) should not be used in school. Any brought in should be handed to the class teacher for safekeeping and collected by the child at the end of the day.

Free School Meals

There are two different Free School Meal Schemes in school.

Universal Free School Meals

Children in **Reception to Year 2** are all entitled to have a free school meal each day under a Government run scheme called **Universal Free School Meals**.

Free School Meal Status

Parents of any children in **Reception to Year 6** who are claiming one of the benefits listed below, are entitled to register for **Free School Meal Status.**

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

For each child who is registered the school will receive £1,445 Pupil Premium funding, which schools have the freedom to spend in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils. If you are eligible for free school meal status, and have not already registered your child/children, please do so and then let the office know, so the we can update our dinner money system.

Apply for Free School Meal Status at www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals or call 0300 123 4048, providing your National Insurance Number and date of birth. Alternatively, please contact the school office with these details and we can apply for you.

Parent Portal and Arbor App

We use Arbor's free Parent Portal and Arbor App to communicate with our parents and offer an on-line payment system for school trips, breakfast and afterschool clubs.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor and see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

- Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready – you won't be able to log in before.
- Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password.
- Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- Click 'install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone and open the App
- Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- Accept the Terms and Conditions and enter your child's birthday
