What are we learning about this term?

ENGLISH

- Instructions
- Stories from other cultures
- Older literature
- Film narrative
- Dramatic conventions
- Persuasion

MATHEMATICS

- Calculating, measuring and understanding shape
- Counting, partitioning and calculating
- Handling data and measures
- Securing number facts, understanding shape

SCIENCE

• Keeping Healthy- this unit helps children to learn that there are many aspects to keeping healthy. Children will learn about healthy eating and what makes a balanced diet. They will also learn about the heart and how heart beat is affected by exercise. Children will also be educated on Tobacco, Alcohol and other drugs which links to the school's education programme for PSHE.

INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY (ICT)

- Multimedia Presentations- Children learn how to make a multimedia presentation using text, images and sounds.
- Control and Monitoring- children learn how to use input devices or switches to control a process

HISTORY

• Aztecs- children will learn about the Aztec civilisation and find out about sources of evidence relating to the Aztecs, such as: food, dress, communication and religion.

GEOGRAPHY

MUSIC

This will be taken from the Music Express unit 'Stars, hide your fires'. Children will develop and demonstrate their ability to take part in a class performance with confidence, expression and control.

ART AND DESIGN

What a performance:

In this unit children investigate headwear and costume worn in different times and cultures, including theatre costume. They use this as a starting point for designing and making a piece of headwear for a character in a story, using a range of textiles and other materials.

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

Fairgrounds:

In this unit children explore input devices or switches and learn how to control a process. They will be producing simple procedures in order to produce a fairground ride that moves.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION
