BSF AND TRANSPORT FOR STUDENTS TO THE PROPOSED GREAT ASHBY SECONDARY SCHOOL SITE

Many prospective secondary school parents are unaware of the promises that the County Council has made about transport to the proposed new secondary school site in Great Ashby.

In simple terms, the County Council have promised that they will put in place transitional arrangements for all students that have to relocate to a new site and so, parents can be confident that if children already attending a secondary school have to travel further when that school moves to the Great Ashby site, they will either be funded to do this, or transport will be arranged.

If it is the Thomas Alleyne School which moves to the new site (and that is the County Council's preferred and proposed option), their Governors have their own money as part of Thomas Alleyne's original legacy, which they will use to ensure a student who starts at this site will receive transport to the new site.
