#### **WORLD MATHS DAY**

We had a wonderful response to World Maths Day. It is the first time that Fairlands have participated in this Worldwide event, which is organised by UNICEF.

Our day started with an assembly, where children counted to ten in Welsh, Polish, Tagalog, Dutch, Afrikaans, German, Urdu, Spanish, Italian, Punjabi, and Polish.

Children then enjoyed exploring mathematical investigations, including some based on a tube of Smarties, and took part in a team Mental Maths Mayhem competition. The winning teams were awarded a small prize. There was also a prize for 'Mathematician of the Day' in each class.

During the day each class visited the ICT suit to participate in the Worldwide Challenge. Our overall total of correct answers for the day was a staggering 53,011! We didn't quite make the Wall of Fame on the official website, but will be creating our own version, which will be published on our website shortly, and these children will be receiving certificates.

The day finished with our World Maths Day Fun Maths Roadshow. Over 60 people attended this fun event, including children from the Nursery to Y6, where parents were able to work on problem solving activities and mathematical games with their children.

Thank you to all the parents, who came into help - we couldn't have managed without you! Also thank you to Mrs. Dunthorne, our school secretary, for the work involved in the creation of the password cards for each child and the other extra paperwork that goes with these events.

#### **WORLD BOOK DAY**

World book day was a great success. The theme for the day was 'The Best Place to Read.' Children from Nursery to year 6 were asked to design and construct a reading area in their learning environment with a budget of £20.

Children and staff worked enormously hard and each class produced a fabulous reading area. Some designs were very imaginative; a beach, a jungle, a space station and a magic carpet to name but a few! The winning design, however, belonged to Cherry class who created a Space Age reading area. They won themselves £50 worth of book tokens to spend on their class library. Well done Cherry!

Hawthorn won £15 worth of books for their class for bringing in the most photographs of their class reading.

#### PLEASE HELP US WITH HEADLICE!

Re-infestations are becoming troublesome, but if everyone takes note of the following preventative measures, then the problem should be dramatically reduced. The local Health Authority recommends the following preventative method and suggests that parents should take the responsibility of checking their child's hair regularly.

Head lice may be cleared over a two-week period by the following method:

- Wash the hair in the normal way with an ordinary shampoo.
- Using lots of hair conditioner and, while the hair is very wet, comb through the hair from the roots with a fine tooth comb. Make sure the teeth of the comb slot into the hair at the roots with every stroke, and do this over a pale surface, such as a paper towel or the bath.
- Clear the comb of lice between each stroke.
- Wet lice find it difficult to escape, and hair, which is slippery from conditioner, makes it hard for them to keep a grip – so removal with the comb is easier.
- If you find any lice, then repeat this routine every 3-4 days for 2 weeks, so that any lice emerging from the eggs are removed before they can spread.
