What are we learning about this term?

ENGLISH

Narrative:

MATHEMATICS

- Counting, partitioning and calculating
- Securing number facts, understanding shape

SCIENCE

<u>Habitats</u>

Children will begin to understand the concept of a habitat, how it provides organisms found there with conditions for life and how animals depend on plants or other animals for food.

Light and shadows

This unit introduces the relationship between light, an object and the formation of shadows. Children observe the apparent movement of the Sun and the associated changes in shadows.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

<u>Neighbours</u>

This unit allows pupils to reflect on the responsibility people feel to care for others. Pupils understand that 'Love your neighbour' is one of two golden rules found in all major religions in some form or another. The other golden rule is 'Love God'.

Becoming an adult

This unit is intended to explore becoming an adult and discuss the themes that are addressed by different religious initiation ceremonies and their effect on people's lives. Not all religions have specific ceremonies welcoming members into adulthood but Christianity, Judaism, Sikhism and Hinduism do.

Manipulating sounds & Email

HISTORY

Tudors Rich & poor in Tudor Britain

Children learn about the lives of different types of people living in Tudor times. Children will find out about the characteristic features of society at a time in the distant past by asking and answering questions from a range of different sources of information.

Henry VIII

Children find out about the Tudors through the story of Henry VIII's marriages. They develop their ability to use written and pictorial sources, ask and answer questions, give reasons for actions and identify changes.

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

Money containers

Children learn how textiles containers *eg purses, wallets and belt bags* are designed for different purposes and different users. They design patterns/templates, and join and reinforce fabrics.

Sandwich Snacks

Children learn basic food preparation techniques and ways of combining components to create simple food products for a particular purpose. They develop their making skills by learning to combine components according to taste, appearance or texture to create a product that contributes to a healthy diet.
