REPORTING PRIVATE FOSTERING ARRANGEMENTS

A privately fostered child is one who is looked after by adults who are not close relatives e.g. a cousin, great aunt, friend of the family, the parent of a friend of the child. Grandparents, step-parents, aunts, uncles, brothers and sisters are not viewed as private foster carers.

The arrangement is made privately, i.e. without the involvement of a local authority, for the care of a child who is under the age of 16 for a period of 28 days or more.

It is an offence for a parent or a private foster carer to fail to inform a local authority of a private fostering arrangement, however, some parents will not be aware of the legislation. If you are planning to privately foster a child or are aware of a private fostering arrangement, please report the arrangement either to school or to social care on 01438 737500.
