ON-LINE PARENTS' SCHOOL NETWORK

A new online parents' school network has been recently launched for all secondary schools in the UK by Netmums, working with DadTalk.

HELP WITH YOUR FAMILY'S FINANCE

WaterSure is a national scheme introduced by the Government in 2000, which allows households who are on a water meter <u>and</u> meet the criteria to have their water bills capped so they don't have to worry about the amount of water they use or about the cost!

To apply, you must be on a water meter and in receipt of a benefit (*means tested*) with one or both of the following conditions:

- Use more water than average because you have 3 or more children in your family
- Have a health/medical condition that means you use more water then usual
