DO YOU WANT A FREE COMPUTER?

The government has launched a scheme called the 'Home Access' grant, which makes funding accessible for eligible children in years 3–9 to have access to a home computer, by funding a FREE COMPUTER for some families. If you think you might be eligible anad would like to know more about this grant please contact Mrs Trafford, via the school office.

VALUABLES IN SCHOOL

Please can I remind parents that children should not be bringing mobile phones to school. If a child does, unavoidably, bring one in, they will be asked to hand it into the office until the end of the school day.

This also applies to jewellery. For health & safety purposes, please do not allow your child to wear any jewellery other than stud earrings as, again, they will be asked to remove them and to collect them from the office at the end of the school day.

STEVENAGE CREDIT UNION

Fairlands Primary School continues to be the top school for young savers in Stevenage – including Mr Staples (!) - but we still need more to join in!

The Stevenage Credit Union is a savings club which collects from a number of schools in Stevenage and enables the children to learn about cash handling at an early age. They can plan what they do with their pocket money perhaps save for a holiday, christmas or family birthdays.

On joining, children receive a drawstring bag and a savings chart.. After 12 weeks they receive another gift and, if they save regularly, this continues every 12 weeks.

We also encourage parents to join as adult members – now is a good time to start saving for summer holidays or you could join our Christmas Savings Club, to ease the Christmas cash flow! There is no limit to the amount you can save and you can withdraw the money whenever you want it.

The Credit Union is run at Fairlands School in the Upper Hall every **Tuesday at 3.15pm** – come along this week and find out more.

DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE UNDER 16 WHO IS LIVING AWAY FROM THEIR PARENTS?

A privately fostered child is one who is looked after by adults who are not close relatives e.g. a cousin, great aunt, friend of the family, the parent of a friend of the child. Grandparents, step-parents, aunts, uncles, brothers and sisters are not viewed as private foster carers.

The arrangement is made privately, i.e. without the involvement of a local authority, for the care of a child who is under the age of 16 for a period of 28 days or more.

It is an offence for a parent or a private foster carer to fail to inform a local authority of a private fostering arrangement, however, some parents will not be aware of the legislation. If you are planning to privately foster a child or are aware of a private fostering arrangement, please report the arrangement either to school or to social care on 01438 737500.
