#### **PARK & STRIDE!**

Are you experiencing difficulties parking in Pound Avenue? Why not PARK & STRIDE - there is often plenty of space in Sish Lane or on Haycroft Road, so please consider parking a little way from the school and having a short stroll in for a stress-free start & end to the school day! Better still, let Mr Staples know this is what you are doing and he will give your child a special 'Park & Stride' Certificate in assembly!

#### **SCHOOL DINNER MONEY**

Just a reminder that school dinners have gone up slightly and now cost £1.90 per day / £9.50 per week.

#### **BIKES**

If children come to school on a bike, please make sure that they are wearing a **helmet** and that they have a **lock** to secure the bike whilst it is at school. We are currently trying to secure funding to provide a proper cycle storage facility. In the meantime, bikes can be padlocked to the fencing to the right of both of the new entrance gates. Of course, any bike is left at your own risk whilst on school premises.

#### **PARKING IN SCHOOL CAR PARK**

We still have a small number of parents attempting to park in the school car parks to drop off or pick up their children. This is very unsafe and I would ask you again not to do it. The gates will be closed at the beginning and end of the day to attempt to prevent this. Please do not ask staff, or taxi drivers to unlock the gates for you.

#### **ENGLISH LANGUAGE CLASS**

These sessions are held every week on **Tuesday** mornings from 9 – 11am, in the Learning Room (upper building). We will advise you of the start date asap.
