INFORMATION SENT OUT FROM SCHOOL

You will be aware that from time to time, the school puts leaflets and flyers in your child's book bag from third-party providers, such as businesses and community groups etc. As a rule, we will only send out information advertising extended school services, such as clubs and after-school activities. We do not send out information relating to individal religious organisations as we are a community school which serves a diverse catchment. We do make every effort to vet this information for quality and appropriateness before it is given to your child. It is parents' responsibility to decide if they want to make use of these products or services.

WALK TO SCHOOL WEEK

Monday, 18th to Friday, 22nd October (last week of half term) will be Walk to School Week. We will be encouraging as many children as possible to walk to school or 'Park and Stride'.

FAIRLANDS SCHOOL BREAKFAST CLUB

Our popular **Breakfast Club** runs **every morning**, **Monday to Friday**.

The club is open to all Fairlands' children from Nursery to Year 6 and **runs in the dining hall** from 8.00am until registration (Foundation & KS1 children are walked to their classrooms).

Cost £2.00 for first child, siblings £1.70 (Free school meals £1.50). No need to book – just turn up at 8.00am.

END OF SCHOOL DAY PROCEDURES

Parents should be aware that staff in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 will normally only hand children over to their parents at the end of the school day. However, if you make arrangements for someone who does not have parental responsibility to collect your child, you must inform the school in advance. If it is just a one off arrangement, please either let the teacher know at the start of the day or contact the school office by phone or text. If this is to be an ongoing arrangement, we would ask you inform us in writing beforehand.

In Key Stage 2, you should be aware that we do not necessarily hand children directly over to their parents. Some parents expect children to walk home on their own and some expect them to walk to an agreed meeting point in order to develop their independence. Therefore, you must be aware that it is your responsibility individual to make arrangements with your child as to what they should do when they are dismissed at 3.15pm. If you feel it is necessary, then please let the class teacher know what those arrangements are in advance. If a child appears confused about what those arrangements are, we will always keep them safe at school until we are able to contact the parents for clarification.
