#### CHILDRENS' HEALTH ISSUES

**SICKNESS AND DIARRHOEA:** As there have been a larger than usual number of cases of sickness and diarrhoea in school this week, if your child becomes unwell, please keep them off school for 48 hours after the last bout of illness – thank you.

**SLAPPED CHEEK:** There have been a number of cases of Slapped Cheek Syndrome in school recently. This is a viral infection, which initially presents with cold and cough symptoms. Once the rash appears it is no longer infectious and there is no reason for your child to be absent from school, unless they are feeling unwell. If you or your child has a weakened immune system such as sicklecell or you are pregnant and are concerned, please see your GP.

**Measles outbreaks and MMR vaccine:** As you are aware, there are an increasing number of measles cases and local outbreaks being reported. HCC are encouraging **parents of children aged 10-16** to ensure their children are vaccinated or, if they are unsure whether they have been vaccinated, check with their GP. Parents of **children under this age** need to check with their GP that their children have had two doses of MMR.
