Just one week of Beat the Street left to go! We have some great news - to help you reach the target of 500,000 miles and get a £1000 donation split between your local charities Stevenage and District Riding for Disabled Group and Stevenage Arts Guild, every Beat Box in Hemel Hempstead, Watford, Broxbourne and Stevenage will be worth double points after the first tap.

There will also be some “Golden Beat Boxes” around the four towns, which are in surprise locations up until the end of the competition. Find them and get 50 points and a possible lucky tap prize of a Harry Potter studio tour at Warner Bros studios at Leavesden near Watford.

It's all about the final push to encourage people to walk, cycle and run right up until the last day of the competition. More than 38,000 players are taking part and so far you've walked 330,000 miles. We want you all to keep tapping right up until the last day which is Wednesday, 15th July, and to keep up the active lifestyles beyond that!

For the person who walks the furthest on one day throughout the competition, Paradise Wildlife Park tickets are up for grabs. So why not set yourself a challenge in the last week, like one walker who decided to walk 100 miles. But be warned- she has already beaten her target, worn out her trainers in the process and has had to buy a new pair!

Across the county, Saint Albert the Great Catholic Primary School in Hemel Hempstead is in the lead for the highest average score (919) and they have walked more than 20,000 miles.

While in your area, Martins Wood Primary School is in the lead yet again for the most miles walked – they have walked more than the distance around the world – an amazing 26,000 miles! Not too late for all the other schools to try and catch them!
