- Children with long hair must tie it back with a hair band or, for swimming, wear a swimming hat.

## Free School Meals

Parents who wish their child to have a school meal in Years 3 to 6 will be asked to pay, unless you are claiming one of the benefits listed below, in which case you may be entitled to register for **Free School Meal Status:** 

- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit element)
- (Income Related) Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with income below £16,1990 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit

If you think you are eligible or become eligible through the school year, either apply on line at <u>www.hertsdirect.org/freeschoolmeals</u>, or call 0300 123 4048, providing your National Insurance Number and date of birth. Alternatively, please contact the school office with these details and we can apply for you.

For each child whose parent is entitled to and registered for Free School Meal Status (FSM), the school will receive £1,320 **Pupil Premium** funding. Schools have the freedom to spend this funding in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils. At this school, the funding is used for children to receive tailored support from a Pupil Premium Champion. For more information on Pupil Premium funding visit <u>www.gov.uk</u>

## Attendance

Children of school-age who are registered at a school must, by law, attend school regularly.

Regular attendance is important, not just because the law requires it, but because it is the best way of ensuring that a child makes the most of the educational opportunities which are available to him or her.

There may be rare occasions when a child has to miss school – for example, if he or she is very unwell. Any other absences should be kept to an absolute minimum. In particular, parents should never take their child out of school during term-time in order to go on holiday.

If your child is absent from school, we expect you to inform us of the reason. Please contact the office by phone, text or email by 10.00am on the first day of absence.

If your child has an unavoidable appointment during the school day, please ensure you inform the school office beforehand. If the appointment means that your child will be late to school, please also ensure you book their school meal in advance.
