BREAKFAST CLUB

7.45am – 8.50am - Dining Hall (Upper Building)
No need to book

NURSERY LUNCH CLUB

(for morning/afternoon nursery children)

Drop off 11.20am to 11.25am (at Nursery external door) The door will be shut promptly at 11.25am

Pick up 12.30pm (at the same door)

If your child attends Nursery Lunch Club, we ask that you **provide them** with a healthy packed lunch or purchase a school packed lunch or vegetarian option.

Please let us know, each Friday which days your child will be attending Lunch Club the following week. This will enable us to ensure that lunchtimes are appropriately staffed.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

Our After School Club, for children in Nursery and Reception is run in the lower building Family Room. Bookings can be made on the School Gateway. Bookings will be taken on a first come, first served basis.

30 Hours Funding

If you have registered for your child to attend our Nursery for 30 hours per week, 8.30am – 3.30pm every day, your child's day will be as follows:

Drop off and pick up: Please use the Nursery main entrance, as marked on the site map (back page).

Nursery Lunch Club: As part of our offer, we are happy to provide the childcare part of Nursery Lunch Club for free. You will, however, need to either provide your child with a healthy packed lunch or purchase a school packed lunch or vegetarian option. If you wish to purchase a school packed lunch, please ensure you tell your child's teacher that morning, or you can book on a weekly basis. Payment for meals can be made using the Schoolgateway.

We strongly advise that you stick to the allocated hours as much as possible.

Every 3 months, your 30 hour code will enter a grace period and you will need to log into your HMRC account to re-check your eligibility. You will receive a message both from HMRC and school asking you to do this as soon as possible.

Please contact the school office:

- If you wish to take advantage of the 30 hours childcare.
- If you are eligible and wish to share the 30 hours funding with your childminder (i.e. 15 hours at school, 15 hours with childminder).
- If you are not eligible for funding, but wish to pay for an extra 15 hours.

Attendance

One of the most important aspects of coming to Nursery is getting your child into the routine of attending a setting.

When your child starts Nursery, we will work very closely with you to ensure those routines are set up as smoothly as possible and support you to ensure your child attends every day.

If your child is absent from Nursery, we ask that you to inform us of the reason. Please contact the office by phone, text, email or Schoolgateway on the first day of absence.

Once your child starts full-time school in Reception and turns 5 years old, it becomes legally compulsory for them to attend every day, so we aim to start good habits early!

Schoolcoms/Schoolgateway

We use an electronic system to communicate with our parents and offer an on-line payment system for school meals, school trips, breakfast and afterschool clubs. Please ensure you have provided us with an up-to-date email address and mobile phone number, so that we can keep you informed of school You can register and download the app at www.schoolgateway.com

We have very strong links with our local Family Centres.

The Family Centre Service was developed in October 2018, and is the integrated partnership of the Children's Centre Teams and the Public Health Nursing Teams (Health Visitors and School Nurses)

There are 6 Family Centres in Stevenage and all are situated on the old Children's Centre sites.

Family Centres continue to offer:

- Information on available local early years provision
- Support for children with additional needs and disabilities.
- Parent support including courses and one to one support
- Play sessions and outdoor activities.
- Local advice and information for parents.
- Access to information, training and career opportunities.
- Child and family health services, including antenatal services, development checks, well-being clinics and infant feeding support

Family Centres continue to support all families with children up to the age of 5 years, but are now able to provide ongoing support until the child reaches 11 years of age
