## **School Uniform**

#### All children are strongly encouraged to wear school uniform:

- White shirt/polo shirt
- Grey tailored skirt/trousers/shorts
- Navy school sweatshirt, navy school cardigan OR plain navy jumper, sweatshirt or cardigan
  - Plain navy, grey or black tights; or white, black or grey socks
    - Black shoes, sandals or boots
- In the summer, a summer dress with blue and white checks or stripes

#### PE Kit / Swimming kit

- Shorts plain navy
- Tops plain white or navy
- Footwear inside bare feet
- Footwear outside ankle trainers that can be fastened
- Winter kit plain sweatshirt and jogging bottoms
- During PE lessons, all children will be asked to remove wrist watches and remove/cover their earrings. All classes will have a roll of tape to cover studs during PE lessons.
- Swimming swimming costume or trunks and towel. Bermuda shorts / bikinis may NOT be worn, as requested by the pool managers.

## **Attendance**

Once your child starts full-time in Reception and turns 5, it becomes legally compulsory for him/her to attend school every day. We will work very closely with you to help you achieve this.

Regular attendance is important, not just because the law requires it, but because it is the best way of ensuring that a child makes the most of the educational opportunities which are available to him or her.

There may be rare occasions when a child has to miss school – for example, if he or she is very unwell. Any other absences should be kept to an absolute minimum. In particular, parents should never take their child out of school during term-time in order to go on holiday.

If your child is absent from school, we expect you to inform us of the reason. Please contact the office by phone, text or email by 10.00am on the first day of absence.

If your child has an unavoidable appointment during the school day, please ensure you inform the school office beforehand. If the appointment means that your child will be late and your child requires a school meal, please ensure you book this in advance.

Each parent with PR is individually responsible for their child's attendance.

### **Free School Meals**

There are two different Free School Meal Schemes in school.

#### **Universal Free School Meals**

Children in **Reception to Year 2** are all entitled to have a free school meal each day under a Government run scheme called **Universal Free School Meals**.

#### Free School Meal Status

Parents of any children in **Reception to Year 6** who are claiming one of the benefits listed below, are entitled to register for **Free School Meal Status**.

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

For each child who is registered the school will receive £1,320 Pupil Premium funding, which schools have the freedom to spend in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils. If you are eligible for free school meal status, and have not already registered your child/children, please do so and then let the office know, so the we can update our dinner money system.

We have very strong links with our local Family Centres.

The Family Centre Service was developed in October 2018, and is the integrated partnership of the Children's Centre Teams and the Public Health Nursing Teams (Health Visitors and School Nurses)

There are 6 Family Centres in Stevenage and all are situated on the old Children's Centre sites.

#### Family Centres continue to offer:

- Information on available local early years provision
- Support for children with additional needs and disabilities.
- Parent support including courses and one to one support
- Play sessions and outdoor activities.
- Local advice and information for parents.
- Access to information, training and career opportunities.
- Child and family health services, including antenatal services, development checks, well-being clinics and infant feeding support

Family Centres continue to support all families with children up to the age of 5 years, but are now able to provide ongoing support until the child reaches 11 years of age

#### HERTFORDSHIRE SCHOOL NURSING SERVICE

**The School Nursing Service** is also part of the Hertfordshire Family Centre Service.

**The School Nursing Service** works together with children and young people their parents/carers and school staff, to provide a comprehensive efficient and accessible service which:

- Helps children keep healthy during their school days and for the rest of their lives
- Prevents ill health in children and the local community
- Supports children with medical needs and those needing medication
- Ensures that educational potential is not hampered by unmet health needs
- Monitors and supports families in relation to Hertfordshire Safeguarding Policies

When your child commences school at the age of five, care is transferred from the Health Visiting Service to the School Nursing Service. The service has four distinct areas that it offers to children attending a Hertfordshire mainstream school.

School aged immunisations are offered to all Hertfordshire children, including those who are home educated.

All Reception children will be seen for growth, vision and hearing screening. Parents are informed of the results, with further growth monitoring in Year 6.
