SENCo will be available at parent teacher consultations and by contacting school office for an appointment.



Medical Information



- Please update the office with any new medical issues.
- If your child has an accident at school you will be informed through the accident information sheet. If your child has a head bump, they will be provided with a wrist band.
- We can only administer antibiotics if they are prescribed 4 x daily
- Make us aware of any injuries they have before coming into school
- Ensure that we always have up to date contact numbers
- Due to severe nut allergies, we ask that no nuts are brought into school. If your child does have a nut allergy please call the school as soon as possible to inform us. We can organise for a Health Care Plan!
- If your child has a food allergy, you will need to register your them with HCL before they are able to have a school meal. Please speak to us about this.



Safeguarding



- Please do not use mobile phones in the school, classrooms, on trips or whilst helping out
- Let us know if someone new is collecting your child which we can add to the yellow form.
- Please encourage your child to walk with their bike or scooter when they reach the school entrance gate
- If you wish to collect your child outside the school hours then you must do so from the school office.



Uniform

You will need...

- Uniform is the same as reception.
- P.E. day is currently on a Monday for Year 1-the children will come into school with their P.E. kit on.

There is more information on the school website, including links to suppliers of uniform with the school logo.

Please also note that your child's uniform will get messy at some point! Playing with paint, mud and other sensory materials is great for your child's brain development and aprons/all in one waterproofs are never perfect. It is fine to send your child to school in uniform that has been washed but has stains ©

Please also remember to send your child into school with;

- Coat
- Change of clothes including underwear
- Book bag
- Sun hat
- Wellies (these can be kept in school)

Please make sure everything is clearly named

Attendance

School Times

The gate will be opened at 8.40am, children must enter their classroom before 8.50am. Please queue in the allocated pathway in the Lower Building Car Park, ensuring your child stays with you, if you are waiting for the gate to open.

Children will be dropped off at the gate and make their own way into class.

At the end of the day, the gate will open at 3.10pm.

We strongly encourage attendance above 95% and ask that you arrive promptly, before the gate closes at 8.50am. Attendance will be a whole school focus for the Autumn term.

Breakfast Club/ After School Club

Breakfast Club (Everyday from 7.45am – 8.50am)

Breakfast Club takes place on the Upper Site in the main dining hall. Staff will bring the children down to Nursery for the start of the morning session.

Breakfast Club can be booked on Arbor, the prices per day are currently...

<u>After School Club (3.30pm – 6.15pm)</u>

After School Club takes place on the Lower Site with Reception and Year One, in the Family Room. Collection will be at the external doors by Fairlands Pre-School.

After School Club can be booked on Arbor, the price per day is:

- 3.30pm-4.15pm £8.50 (Less £1 for sibling)
- 3.30pm-5.15pm £9.50 (Less £1 for sibling)
- 3.30pm-6.15 £10.50 (Less £1 for sibling)

Prices is currently being reviewed.




Lunchtime

Lunchtime Arrangements

- Lunchtime for Year 1 is 12:30-1:30. Children will be offered a healthy snack during the morning.
- All children will eat in the hall in the Lower Building.
- After lunch, the children access the lower building playground for a play time.
- All children in Reception to Year 2 are entitled to a universal free school meal, this encourages your child to try new foods.

A healthy, balanced lunch may include...




A sandwich or crackers and cheese Some rice cakes or crisps A piece of fruit (please refrain from packing grapes) A yoghurt

Word Reading: Phonics

In September, we will be joining the Little Wandle Phonics programme. We will be inviting parents to a workshop to learn more about the programme. It is vital that <u>all</u> parents attend. Once children are off to a flying start with their reading, they will be assigned an e-book to practise at home. The programme includes:


- Daily phonics sessions

- 3 weekly reading practise sessions in school
- E-library for parents to access at home

At the end of Year 1, children will be completing the phonics screening check assessment. This usually takes place in early June.








Topics change every half term. The topics in Year 1 are;

Supporting your child at home & Transition

Summer Holiday Suggestions...

- Reading with your child at home
- Support your child to develop their independence, over the summer
- Share the transition booklet over the summer holidays
- Keep your routine at home the same within the first few weeks of starting Year 1
- Your child may like to write their new teacher a postcard about their summer holidays (please write the Fairlands Primary School address on it)

Reading

- Your child will need a school book bag. Please bring your child's book bag to school everyday!
- Your child will be given a library book that you can share together e.g. The Hungry Caterpillar. This will be changed every week.
- Children should log in to the Little Wandle E-Library to practise the decodable book they have practised in class.

Home Learning

Every Friday, your child will bring home a homework flyer linked to what they been learning in school. This will contain information on...

- An project related to our topic
- News and information about the coming week
- What your child has been doing during the week

We love to hear about learning that takes place at home, you can upload photographs and information to your child's Evidence Me online account.

How can I support my child in Year 1?









- -Read! The library is a brilliant place to start in summer
- -Talk- encourage your child to ask questions and to wonder about the world around them as well as listen to others and think about their point of view.
- -Play board games- this encourages social skills and problem solving, amongst other skills.
- -Give your child opportunities to practise handwritingforming letters on paper, in flour in a baking tray, or any other way you can think of. Forming letters is tricky!
- -When your child starts Y1, make sure they come to school every day and are at school on time, it is so important!
