INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY (ICT)

Controlling devices

Children learn that devices can be connected to a computer to monitor and measure changes in environmental conditions. Children gain an understanding of computer monitoring of external conditions.

Multi Media Presentations

Children will be combining text, pictures and sound to create a cross curricular presentation.

HISTORY/ GEOGRAPHY

Aztecs- children will learn about the Aztec civilisation and find out about sources of evidence relating to the Aztecs, such as: food, dress, communication and religion.

MUSIC

Children sing and play a variety of songs, play instrumental accompaniments and rehearse and develop musical and performance ideas with understanding of how to achieve a quality class performance.

ART AND DESIGN

What a Performance

Children will design and make a mask or hat for a literary character. This will involve using straw, silver foil, card, fabric, lace, ribbon and a variety of other materials.

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

There will be no D.T taught this term.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Athletics

Children focus on developing their technical understanding of athletic activity. They learn how to set targets and improve their performance in a range of running, jumping and throwing activities.

As in all athletic activities, children think about how to achieve the greatest possible speed, height, distance or accuracy.

Games

Children develop the range and quality of their skills and understanding for striking and fielding games. They learn how to play the different roles of bowler, wicket-keeper, backstop, fielder and batter.

In all games activities, children have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition. In striking and fielding games, players achieve this by striking a ball and trying to deceive or avoid fielders, so that they can run between wickets or around bases to score runs. When fielding, they try to prevent runs or points being scored.
